The value of Gukesh's first win over Carlsen

The Norwegian world No.1 had the world champion on the ropes but the Indian stayed calm to seal a memorable triumph

STAVANGER. NORWAY: Endings in chess are defined by handshakes. Here, the fists had taken over. Magnus Carlsen banged his right fist on the table holding the board. Such was the fury that it shook the remaining pieces to stumbling submission. Moments later, D Gukesh walked out of the playing area and delivered a double fist bump to his waiting coach. Such was the force that Grzegorz Gajewski felt an unprecedented blow. "Not that hard," Gajewski said when asked if Gukesh had ever given him a fist bump so hard. "I mean, he had his reason.'

The reason was that Gukesh. the 19-year-old reigning world champion, had beaten Carlsen, the 34-year-old world No.1, for the first time ever in classical chess in Round 6 of the Norway Chess here on Sunday. It featured a spectacular meltdown after a typical Magnus Masterclass. It featured every expert's prediction here of another Carlsen win over Gukesh during the course of the game being thrown out of the window in the end. It featured an eye-popping late blunder and a mind-boggling burst of emotion.

The Norwegian's incredible physical reaction, which also slightly shook the Indian teen seated across, was immediately backed up by a "sorry". "Oh my God!" Carlsen yelled while getting up and flapping his right arm. Another "sorry" followed, and then a tap on his opponent's back before sprinting out of the venue without, for the first time in this

tournament, stopping for anybody or anything.

Gukesh, usually stoic, was left stunned. He got up from his chair and began walking, the right hand covering his mouth and eventually the entire face. After walking back and forth for several seconds, he stood still, head down, both hands on the hip as the spectators broke the tension for an applause.

This was your world champion – coming out all grit from a gruelling marathon in which he appeared to be faltering for most part until, somehow, fighting and flinging to the finish line. "99 out of 100 times. I would lose," Gukesh told TV2, the broadcaster. "Just a lucky day.

"Well, we could say it was lucky," Gajewski said. "But we have to give a lot of credit to Guki for his stubbornness.

Gukesh had succumbed to blundering in time pressure in their first meeting at the opening round. Five days later playing with white pieces, the Indian was served a clinical Carlsen show that had him staring down the barrel right into the endgame. Carlsen was expected to close it out but, in a time scramble, it was his turn to unravel, Carlsen's 44...f6 brought the game back in balance, before Gukesh's 52...Nd7 and Carlsen's Ne2+ overturned it dramatically.

"He (Gukesh) was lost for so long. Yet he kept kicking and kicking and the lower the time went. the more chances he had to actually do something," Gajewski said. Even as the emotions settled

Gukesh still couldn't fathom what had happened and how exactly he had pulled it off. A significant barrier, however, had certainly been pushed. "First classical win over . Magnus," Gukesh told TV2. "Not the way I expected (or) wanted it to be, but I will take it.'

More so given the context and timing. The Indian's world title high of last December had come with a floating asterix of the fivetime world champion missing in action and Gukesh having never beaten Carlsen in the classical form. It carried into the Norway Chess where the Indian lost to Carlsen early and, in an extension of his quiet form since wearing the world champion tag, had just one classical win coming into the reverse rounds. "It just gives a huge bump of confidence," Gajewski said of why this win matters, no matter how. "Because once you've done it, you know you can do it again. And that's the plan."

The meltdown had a clear hangover on Carlsen, who returned to the venue less than 24 hours later again questioning his future in classical chess and settling for a quick draw with Hikaru Nakamura. Speaking after his Armageddon win, Carlsen credited Gukesh for his fight, and added that on a "normal day, of course, I win that game".

Speaking ahead of his match to Take Take Take app: "Losses are painful no matter what... at least if I lose doing something I enjoy, then it's much easier... It's just that in situations like vesterday, I was wondering, 'why am I doing this? What's the point?". Carlsen said he will try to do his 'best in the last three games and then we'll see'."

Carlsen reiterated he doesn't find playing classical, a format he seldom plays now, exciting. Nakamura, to add some fuel to it, said after their draw that this might well be the last classical game the two have played with each other.



MUMBAI: Alize Cornet knows just how keen tennis players can be to get back into the locker room after a long, gruelling match. Which is perhaps why she offered to end the on-court interview she was conducting early. "No, this is perfect!" came the instant reply from Lois Boisson, who had waited long enough to savour this moment.

In her first ever match at the Court Philippe Chatrier, the 22-year-old from Dijon in eastern France pulled off the upset of the tournament on Monday, Ranked 361 in the world, Boisson beat world No.3 Jessica Pegula 3-6, 6-4, 6-4 in two hours and 40 minutes to make it to the quarter-final of the French Open. And all this in her first appearance at a Grand Slam. Asked if she expected this sort of performance, "not really," came the translated reply.

"Before the match I knew there was a possibility, I knew she was tough. And through the match I gave my all, in the end I won, which is incredible.

What is also remarkable is Boisson's journey to her Grand Slam debut. She had been handed a wild card to the main draw at the French Open last year. But a week before she was expected to play at her first major, she suffered an anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) iniury and had to undergo surgery.

She only returned to the tour in February. During her time away, she did try everything she could to aid her recovery and perhaps even give her some momentum when she got back on court. One of the things she tried was neurovisual training. "It's both visual and vou just do some exercises differently.' Boisson told the Roland Garros website. "You connect the brain with the eyes, and then everything goes faster, you know, so it's really great for tennis. It was after my surgery. We did that (and) I came back faster.

Boisson was introduced to the different training method by her fitness coach Sebastien Durand, who also works with world No.17 Grigor Dimitrov. "The goal is to

make everything as fast as possible. Doing these exercises has greatly improved my reactivity and it now comes naturally.'

In Paris, though, she has truly made her mark. She started off with an opening round win over 24th seed Elise Mertens and followed it up by beating Ukrainian Anhelina Kalinina. In the third round she beat compatriot Elsa Jacquemot. But the biggest win of her career came on Monday.

Pegula looked to be on her way to only a second French Open quarter-final after she put up a solid display in the first set, hitting 15 winners and six unforced errors. Boisson meanwhile managed only four winners and committed 14 unforced errors.

But the French player started to claw her way back in the second set. She earned a timely break of serve in the ninth game before serving it out and taking the match into the decider. The third set proved to be a slugfest. They traded early breaks, the rallies and games grew in length. But backed by a partisan home crowd, Boisson hassled and harried the third seed. Once again, Boisson found the break at the right time - in a 12-minute long ninth game. And then she held on to her serve in a

13-minute game to secure a mem-

orable win.

On Sunday, the streets of Paris were lit up with festivities as the city celebrated the Champions League triumph. Boisson gave the locals another reason to celebrate on Monday.


